- Parents should be encouraged to access and use information about labour markets and future study options to support their children.



# Career and Labour Market Information (LMI) includes information on:

- skills, career pathways and progression routes in the
- local labour market;
- job applications and interviews;
- educational institutions, courses, qualifications, entry
- requirements and costs;
- professional bodies;
- employment sectors, employers, jobs, salaries and
- employment trends;
- jobs, training and apprenticeships;
- job demands and working life;
- financial planning.
